About FCA SGW (Security Gateway)

Starting in 2018, Fiat Chrysler Group (FCA, renamed to Stellantis later after merging with PSA) vehicles such as Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep and RAM are equipped with a **Secure Gateway Module** (also called Security Gateway Module, SGW or SGM). They state that the purpose of the SGW module is to protect the car from being hacked over the network.

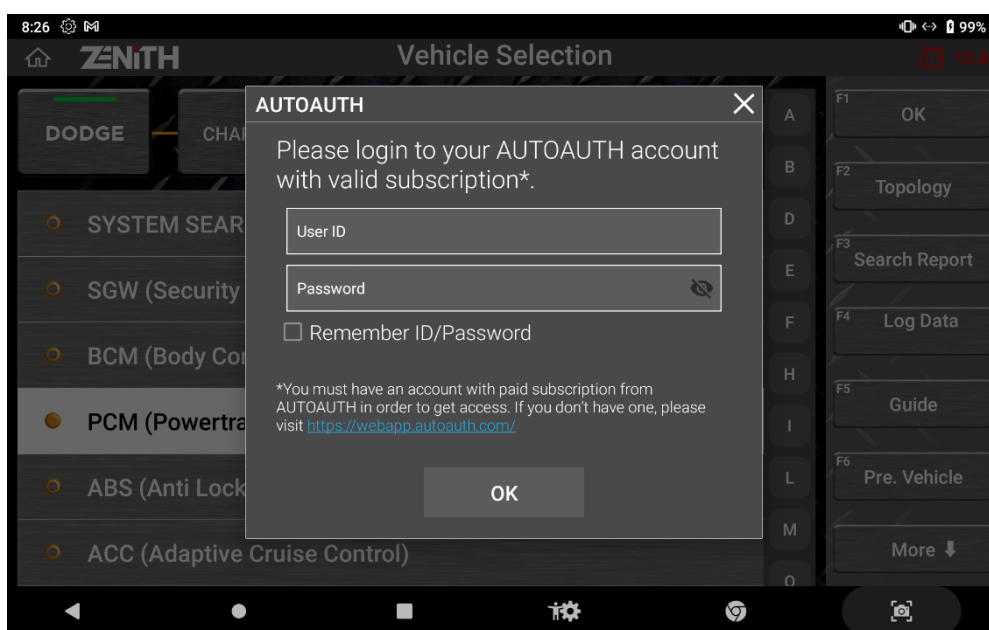
Accessing SGW with Zenith Z5 and G-scan3

In order to conduct full diagnostic functions on the latest FCA vehicles that come with the SGW, you must register your shop, user and device at www.AutoAuth.com.

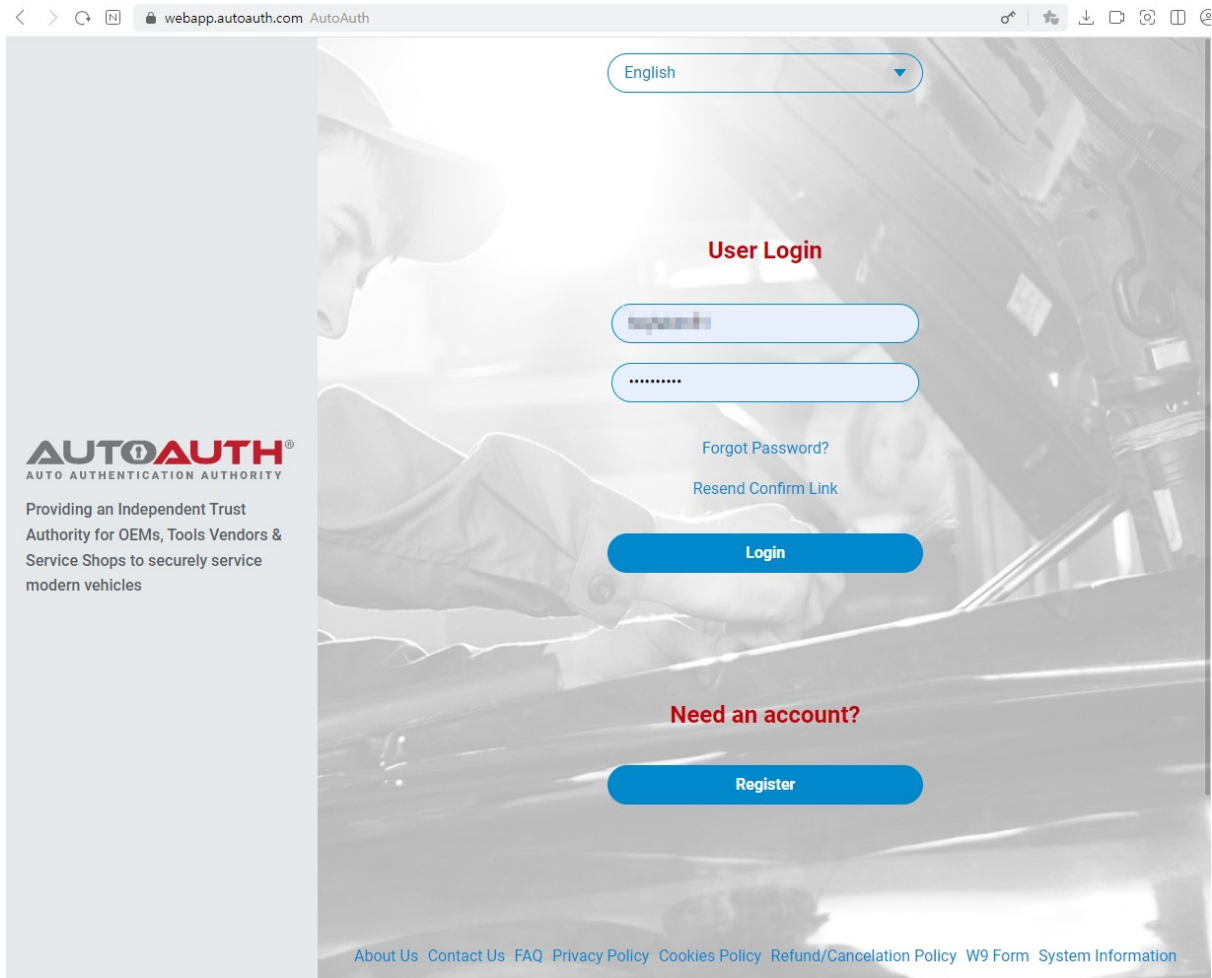
You will be prompted for AutoAuth account login as shown below when you try to conduct any advanced diagnostic functions beyond Fault Code and Data Reding on the SGW installed FCA (Stellantis) vehicles.

Please input the AutoAuth account login ID and Password for authentication which will open the diagnostic session for full functions.

- The tool holds a valid subscription for Zenith Z5 / G-scan updates
- The tool is registered to AutoAuth with valid subscription plan
